
Charge the battery at least once a month, even if the vehicle is not in use. Failure to recharge the battery periodically may result in a battery that will not accept a charge.

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#### **WARNING: SAFETY RIDING RULES**

The user must follow all safety rules and guidelines, or serious injury or death may occur.

- Always use common sense and safe practices when using the vehicle. The user must be at least 3 years old and weigh no more than 35 kg (77 lb).
- This product contains small parts that are for adult assembly only. Keep small children away when assembling. Remove and dispose of all protective material and plastic bags before assembly.
- Riders must always wear a fitted helmet that complies with U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) Standard 16 CFR 1203.
- Only sit on the seat in the vehicle.
- Do not allow more than one rider at a time.
- Do not overload the vehicle. Do not remove the weight restriction decals.
- Do not pull the vehicle with another vehicle or similar device.
- Keep body parts such as hands, legs, hair and clothing away from moving parts.
   Moving parts can cause serious injury.
- Always wear shoes in the vehicle.
- Do not operate near streets or motor vehicles.
- Do not operate near drop-offs such as steps, steep inclines or hills. Operate on relatively level ground.
- Do not operate near water, swimming pools or other bodies of water.
- Do not operate in dangerous weather conditions such as rain or snow.
- Do not operate near loose dirt, mud, sand or fine gravel.
- Do not operate near flammable vapors (gasoline, paint thinner, acetone, etc.).
- Always use the vehicle in a safe, secure environment with adult supervision.
- Adult assembly required.

#### **PREVENT INJURIES AND DEATHS:**

**NEVER LEAVE CHILD UNATTENDED. ALWAYS** keep child in view when child is in vehicle. Direct adult supervision is **REQUIRED.**

 Remove batteries if product is to be left unused for a long time; Always replace the whole set of batteries at one time, taking care not to mix old and new ones, or batteries of different types.



# WARNING: ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIRED


- Before using the vehicle, the rider must understand the vehicle controls and safety instructions.


#### To Charge the Battery:


- 1. Ensure the vehicle is stopped and turned off.
- 2. Unlock and remove the seat.
- 3. Unplug the red battery connector from the red engine connector.
- 4. Connect the red battery connector to the red battery charger connector.
- 5. Plug into a 120 V outlet.

#### To Unplug the Battery:


- 6. Unplug the battery charger from the outlet.
- 7. Unplug the red battery connector.
- 8. Reconnect the red battery connector to the red engine connector.
- 9. Replace the seat and tighten lock.

Note: It is not necessary to remove the battery for charging. However, if the battery does not reach the outlet, it can be removed for charging by disconnecting the red engine connector from the red battery connector, loosening the screw on the left side of the battery bar, removing the battery bar, and then removing the battery.






#### 10 Assemble the Front Wheel




- 1. Gently flip the motorcycle over.
- 2. Slide a brake (13) onto a front fork.
- 3. Place front tire (14) in between the two front forks and the brake.




- 4. Insert the front axle (16) through the front fork, front brake and halfway through the tire.
- 5. Slide the other brake (15) onto the other front fork on the opposite side of tire. Continue to push the axle through the tire, brake and front axle.
- 6. Align the holes on the brakes with the holes on the plastic piece of the front fork. Insert a self-tapping screw (22) into the holes on both sides of the front fork to secure the brakes to the front fork.
- 7. Slide one washer (17) on each side of the front axle.
- 8. Secure the washers with a hexagon nut (19) on both sides of the axle. Use the included wrench (18) to tighten.

#### **Assemble the Rear Fork** 11




- 1. Align the slot on the rear wing bracket (5) with the inner side of the rear, left fork.
- 2. Insert a self-tapping screw (22) through the wing bracket (5) and into the rear fork to secure.

#### 12 Assemble the Rear Wheel




- 1. Insert the rear axle (30) into the left hole of the rear fork. Do not slide all the way through.
- 2. Slide the gear box (31) onto the rear axle. Connect the white connector on the gear box with the white engine connector.


  Note: The protruding piece of the gear box will stick out underneath the rear fork, but will be placed in the rear shield (8) on the next step.
- 3. Slide the rear wheel (23) onto the axle (30), the side of the wheel with the silver piece should connect with gear box (31). Ensure the wheel is fully engaged with gear teeth on gear box (31).
- 4. Slide the washer (17) and inner wheel spacer (28) onto the axle, and then slide the axle through the other rear fork.




- 1. Slide the left support wheel (7) onto the left side of the rear axle.
- 2. Slide the right support wheel (27) onto the right side of the rear axle.
- 3. Slide the rear shield (8) onto the left side of the rear axle. Align the slots on the rear shield with the protrusions on the left fork and snap into place. Ensure the silver cylinder on the gearbox fits into the bottom hole of the rear shield.
- 4. Add a washer (17) and hexagon nut (19) to the axle, then tighten with the included wrench (18).
- 5. On the right side, slide the right support wheel (27) onto the axle, then attach the silver rear axle cover (29), followed by the washer (17) and hexagon nut (19). Tighten with the included wrench (18).



#### 14 Attach the Mud Guard




- 1. Align the slot on the back of the mud guard (4) with the back of the rear wing bracket (5).
- 2. Snap the mud guard onto the rear wing bracket.




- 1. Align the top of the license plate (2) with the slot on the bottom of the back of the motorcycle body.
- 2. Slide the license plate onto the slot until it snaps into place.


#### 16 Assemble the Handle Bars



- 1. Remove the screw (26) and nut (24) from the steering rod.
- 2. Slide the handle bars (9) onto the steering rod. Ensure the holes on the handle bars align with the holes on the steering rod. Note: The Power Button should be on the front of the handlebar. You may need to thread the wires partially through the wire compartment to reach.
- 3. Insert the screw (26) and nut (24) into the handle bar, through the steering axle and tighten with a screwdriver.
- 4. Carefully slide the handle bar wire connector into the wire compartment where the motorcycle wire connector is located.




- 1. Connect the corresponding windshield wire to the handlebar wire, then connect the other windshield wire to the motorcycle wire.
- 2. Align the windshield (10) with the slots on the wire compartment and snap into place, taking care not to damage the wires in the process.




- 1. Align the front bracket (11) with the four slots on the sides of the windshield (10).
- 2. Snap the bottom half of bracket into place, then snap the top half of the bracket into place.


### 18 Assemble the Baggage Rack




- 1. Using a flathead screw driver, turn the seat lock to the unlocked position.
- 2. Remove the seat (6) by lifting on the back of the seat.



- 1. Align the front bar of the baggage rack (3) with the gap on the rear of the battery compartment and snap into place.
- 2. Insert a self-tapping screw (22) into the hole on the back of the baggage rack to secure.
- 3. Ensure the red connector on the battery is connected to the red engine connector before replacing and locking the seat.




- 1. Align the top and front of the exhaust pipe (21) with the slots on the right side of the motorcycle body and snap into place.
- 2. Use a self-tapping screw (22) to secure.




- 1. Align the left round tube (36) with the holes on the motorcycle body. The short side should be on top. Slide the tubes in and repeat on the other side, with the right round tube (37), but with the long side on the top. Press the tubes in until you hear a click.
- 2. Slide the megaphone (34) onto the left fixed round tube and the searchlight (35) onto the right fixed round tube. Make sure both accessory pieces are securely attached before first use.

## Attach the Megaphone Speaker 21



- 1. Slide the buckle on the back of the microphone (32) into the holster on the handlebar (9).
- 2. Plug the microphone into the jack, located under the dashboard.

#### 22 **Product Features**



- 1. Battery: Charge the battery a full 24 hours before first use. Charge the battery for 8-12 hours each additional recharge.
- 2. ON/OFF Button: Press the ON/OFF Button on the front of the motorcycle dashboard to turn ON the motorcycle. The motorcycle will make a revving noise when it is turned ON. Press the ON/OFF Button again to turn the motorcycle off.
- 3. Sounds: Press the red button on the right handle to hear siren sounds and to activate the siren lights.
- 4. Twist Handle Accelerator: Twist the right handlebar to move forward. Motorcycle will stop once twisting motion is released.
- 5. Headlights: The headlights will turn on when the motorcycle is in motion.
- 6. Microphone: Lift the microphone off the holster, then press and hold the button while speaking to hear your voice through the speakers. The speaker connector is located under the dashboard.

#### **Important Battery and Charger Information**

- Only an adult who has read and understands the safety warnings may handle and operate the battery and battery charger. Keep away from children.
- Charge the battery for 24 hours before using the vehicle for the first time.
- Recharge the battery immediately after each use. Charge for at least 8-12 hours, but no more than 20 hours.
- Charge the battery at least once a month, even if the vehicle is not used or stored.
- Never leave the battery in a discharged condition.
- Connect the terminal of the battery and charger, then plug the charger into a 120V AC outlet.
- It is normal for the charger to heat slightly. If the charger rises above 71°C / 160°F, disconnect the charger and call Customer Service for assistance.
- Keep the charger away from water or excessive moisture to prevent short-circuiting.
- Only use the charger specified with the original item. Do not charge the battery with any other charger.
- Do not attempt to recharge non-rechargeable batteries with the original charger.
- Do not replace the battery with any other battery, or the warranty will be voided. If you need a replacement battery, see page 28 for replacement information.
- Remove damaged batteries from the car immediately. Recycle or dispose of the used batteries responsibly.
- Do not short circuit the supply terminals.
- Do not leave the battery connected in the vehicle for extended periods of time when the vehicle is not being used. Disconnect the battery connector from the engine connector before storing.
- The vehicle is equipped with a thermal fuse to protect the electric circuit. If the vehicle cuts out, turn the vehicle off and on to reset.

#### 24 General Care

- Regularly inspect all vehicle parts to ensure they are in good working condition.
- Regularly inspect the charger, cord, plug, and other related parts for damage.
- Remove any damaged parts and immediately contact Customer Service for replacement parts. See Service and Repairs on page 28 for more information.
- DO NOT operate the vehicle if there are any damaged parts.
- Carefully clean the vehicle with a damp cloth and mild soap. Do not get water in or near any electrical parts. Do not wash the vehicle with a hose.
- Store the vehicle indoors or use a tarp to cover it. Keep away from stoves, heaters, or other sources of heat.
